INFORMATION RELATIVE TO 2010 FALL ELECTIONS

- JUNE 1** First day to circulate nomination papers.
- JULY 13** Last day (5:00 p.m.) for candidates to file nomination papers, declaration of candidacy, and campaign registration statement. County Constitutional offices file with the Milwaukee County Election Commission.
- SEPTEMBER 14** PARTISAN PRIMARY – United States Senator, Representative in Congress, State Senator, Representative to the Assembly, Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Sheriff, Clerk of Circuit Court, any Referenda.
- NOVEMBER 2** GENERAL ELECTION – – United States Senator, Representative in Congress, State Senator, Representative to the Assembly, Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Sheriff, Clerk of Circuit Court, any Referenda.

REGISTRATION

All candidates are required to file a Campaign Registration Statement (Form GAB-1) as soon as intent to seek elective office is known and before funds are collected or spent. If a current registration statement is not filed by **Tuesday, July 13, 2010**, the candidate's name may not be placed on the ballot.

NOMINATION PAPERS

If a person signs nomination papers for two candidates for the same office in the election at different times, the earlier signature is valid. Candidates must file a Declaration of Candidacy with their nomination papers.

NOTIFICATION OF NON-CANDIDACY

Any incumbent officeholder who does not intend to seek re-election should file a Notification of Non-candidacy (EB163) no later than 5:00 P.M. on **Friday, July 2, 2010**. **If an incumbent not seeking re-election does not file the notification by the required statutory deadline to seek re-election, the filing deadline will be extended an additional 72 hours for any other person wishing to run for that office.** The deadline is not extended for the incumbent. If an incumbent not seeking re-election files the notification timely, the nomination paper deadline of **July 13, 2010**, is unchanged. If the incumbent has a change of heart after filing the notification, he or she can run for re-election by filing the appropriate ballot access papers by the normal deadline.

STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS

Candidates for County Constitutional offices must file a Statement of Economic Interests with their nomination papers as per Chapter 9, County General Ordinances.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Financial statements will be forwarded to candidates or their treasurers approximately two weeks prior to filing date.
